

Below are 4 pictures that show the life-cycle of a chick. There are then 2 sets of sentences. Chose the set that you think is best for your child to read with you and match them to the correct picture. [If one set is too easy/challenging then try the other one. Remember to encourage your child to segment and then blend the sounds to read each word if they are unsure. Look out for the 'tricky words' that *just do no sound out*']
